

## The Word of God Is Unchangeable

### Introduction

In this lesson, we have arrived at the center of Psalms 119. And in this section we learn the Lord's Word does not change; and in spite of all that seems to happen to His people, the Lord will finish the work that He has already begun.

### 89. For ever, O LORD, thy word is settled in heaven.

- The Word of God is **fixed** firmly and forever in heaven.
- On earth, we wrestle with an ever changing environment, but in heaven we can visualize God's eternal **calm**.
- In spite of all the **opposition** from society and satan, the Word of God will abide forever.

### 90. Thy faithfulness is unto all generations: thou hast established the earth, and it abideth.

- God is not affected by a momentary lapse of judgment or the forgetfulness that comes with **age**, He is consistent to all generations so long as they keep His covenant.
- The promises of God are ancient things, yet they are not **worn** out by centuries of use. - M. Henry

### 91. They continue this day according to thine ordinances: for all are thy servants.

- Heaven and earth obey God's laws, and all are regulated and sustained by His **power**.
- Many of the things we take for granted like - seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night are all **controlled** by God.
- God's ordinance (His regulation) is the reason for the continued existence of **creation**. - Spurgeon

**92. Unless thy law had been my delights,  
I should then have perished in mine affliction.**

- As we **learn** and trust the Word of God, we become more prepared to withstand whatever problem may come our way.
- The Word which has preserved the heavens and the earth also preserves the **people** of God in their time of trial. - L. Ogilvie

**93. I will never forget thy precepts:  
for with them thou hast quickened me.**

- When we have **felt** the quickening (energizing) power of God's Word, we will never forget it.
- Do not **stop** reading the Bible until you find your hearts warmed. Read the word, not only as a history, but labor to be affected by it. - T. Watson

**94. I am thine, save me;  
for I have sought thy precepts.**

- Every Christian is the workmanship of God's hands and has been purchased by God's own blood! - We are God's **property!**
- Even after we have been saved from the penalty of sin, we still need to be saved day by day from defilement and **damage**. - BBC

**95. The wicked have waited for me to destroy me:  
but I will consider thy testimonies.**

- Two things to note about David's enemies - 1. Patience and diligence, in waiting for the **best** time to do him evil. 2. And cruelty without mercy, because their purpose was to destroy him.
- As long as we are **busy** for God, we can expect opposition.

**96. I have seen an end of all perfection:  
but thy commandment is exceeding broad.**

- Meaning - I have seen the end to all (earthly) perfection: But, Your commandment is exceedingly broad ('wide, unlimited').
- Even the most nearly perfect things in this world come to an **end**.
- Only God and His Word are unlimited and endless **perfection**.
